Spay and Neuter Grants

In response to the high volume of spay and neuter requests, RAA has submitted multiple grant applications to address our critical need as the only community-based nonprofit providing these services locally for dogs. We are proud to share that we have been awarded grants from The Community Foundation of Rockbridge, Bath, and Allegheny Counties, as well as a Washington and Lee University's Community Grant. We hope to receive a third grant from the Ursula Landsrath Foundation in December.

From July through October, we received 39 spay and neuter requests, bringing our total to **112 requests** for canine companions since January 2024. Some of our clients are pictured below who recently underwent surgery.

FOOD PANTRY

In October 2024, The News-Gazette published our plea for new board members. While we saw a surge of interest to fill positions and keep RAA viable, we have not secured enough committed individuals for a full board. As a result, the board has made the difficult decision to reduce the number of required board members and, with a heavy heart, to announce the closure of the Pet Food Pantry.

Between August and November, we distributed 5,218 pounds of pet food, along with treats, flea and tick medications, and toys bringing our total of food distributed to 14,483 lbs in 2024. We are deeply grateful to the Lexington Tractor Supply for their unwavering support and to Gleaning for the World, which provides pallets of pet food to over 80 organizations across Virginia.

Operating the pantry is a labor-intensive effort, requiring trips to Concord, Virginia, to pick up pallets of food from Gleaning for the World, loading and unloading pallets of food sometimes by hand, repackaging 1,000+ pound pallets into 10-pound bags, tracking inventory in our database, picking up your food donations at Tractor Supply, setting up the pantry for distribution, and requiring at least seven volunteers to run each event.

Unfortunately, we are not alone in facing these challenges. As demand for nonprofit services increases, the number of Americans volunteering has steadily declined. According to The Washington Post, nearly 40% of nonprofits nationwide struggle to find volunteers, and Rockbridge County—home to over 150 nonprofits—has not been immune. Despite the incredible generosity of our community, there are simply not enough individuals available to fill volunteer roles or dedicate time to organizations in need.

While the Pet Food Pantry will close, RAA remains committed to continuing our other essential programs, including spay and neuter services, veterinary assistance, and senior pet wellness exams.
